



Power of Produce (PoP) Club Booth Volunteer Position Description

About the PoP Club

PoP Club is a free program for kids ages 5 – 12 organized by the Inland Northwest Food Network in cooperation with the Kootenai County Farmers Market. The program encourages children to make healthy food choices by empowering them to “shop” at the farmers market. Each week, club members will be given a token worth \$2 to spend at designated PoP Club Farmer Vendor booths on a fresh fruit, vegetable or plant. In addition, a PoP Club Activity Booth will offer fun, hands-on activities to teach kids how to grow and cook food. The program runs from June 2 – Sept 1, 2018.

About the Position

Volunteers are needed to staff the PoP Club activity booth each week at the market. Specific tasks may vary from week to week, but typically include:

- Assist with booth set up/tear down
- Enroll/check in PoP Club participants
- Assist in directing children in PoP Club activities (these change from week to week)
- Monitor the booth to ensure that the environment that is safe and hygienic (in relation to food handling) for participants
- Assist with disseminating/gathering farmer vendor token jars

Qualifications:

- Enjoy working with children (and adults!)
- Interpersonal skills (strong verbal communication skills, engaging)
- Attentive to order, cleanliness
- Positive attitude
- Passion for healthy food/food systems

Time Commitment

Volunteers are needed to staff the booth each Saturday from June 2 – Sept 1, 2018. Shifts are variable in length (2 hours – 6.5 hours) beginning at 7:30 a.m. The market closes at 1:30; tear down takes approximately 30.”
